But Struggling to Thrive

Few Colleges Meet Adults' Needs:

- Limited after-hours class schedules and services
- Penalties for absences
- Little basic needs support
- Programs lack milestone credentials
- Minimal credit for past experiences

Past experiences contribute richly to classroom discussions




Independent






