Lack of Data Hinders Insight into Departments

Exacerbating Resources in Place of Having Data

A "Data Desert" Campus

Historically, SXU's discussions around program performance occurred infrequently and often focused on financial results. Leveraging data was also burdensome for many reasons.

Burden on Resources



Low Data Accessibility

Department chairs had little access to data – mostly from IPEDS, but at aggregate level



Understaffed IR Office

Institutional Research (IR) staff member manually collected and analyzed data from disparate sources



Concerns About Data Validity

Eight campus leaders held weekly meetings to discuss data validity

The Path to Achieving Departmental Insight



2015-16



SXU underwent Annual Program Prioritization (APP) process

- Institutional Research (IR) office, already understaffed, took on strenuous task of providing data to chairs
- Upon realizing the APP process was unsustainable and inefficient, the Provost reached out to EAB

2016-17



APP data was released

• The data was initially used to start conversations, but the process soon appeared to be punitive and unproductive due to data's inability to provide sufficient insight

2017-18



Committee was formed to create departmental review process

- Deans and division heads received access to APS and can now use the standardized data to identify opportunities to support programs throughout the year
- Faculty Senate created committee to review KPIs and analyses from programs
- All chairs and program directors received access to the APS platform

Aligning KPIs with Institutional Priorities



Strategic KPI Selection

With easy access to data in the APS platform and other data sources, Dr. Costello and a Religious Studies faculty member, who is also a member of the Faculty Senate, chose KPIs to include in the annual unit report.

To choose metrics, they considered what was missing from the APP process and what the Faculty Senate hoped to gain from an annual departmental review process

The chosen KPIs focused on key departmental areas where insight had been lacking

Areas of Focus



Overall Trends

- · Total Credit Hours generated
- · 3 Year Trend in Credits generated
- Illinois state data (majors, 3 year trends)



Supply and Demand

- · Instructional Staff Headcount
- Sections Taught by Instructor Type
- Intercurricular Dependencies (own department majors vs. service majors)



Efficiency

- Median Class Sizes
- Fill Rates
- Percent of Classes with Size < 10
- · Cost per Credit Hour



Student Progress

Course Completion Rates

From Data Desert to Data-Informed



Bringing Transparency to Departmental Review Process

Standardized Departmental Review Process

Through SXU's partnership with APS, campus leaders access data readily – freeing up previously strained resources



100% departments served in review process



100% department chairs have easy access to departmentlevel data



One full-time IR employee's time and skills reallocated to other areas of need



Zero weekly meetings with campus leaders necessary to discuss data validity



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Using APS to Facilitate Data-Informed Discussions

Two Areas of Focus This Year: Departmental Standards and Faculty Workload



- Sought to understand if there was variation in faculty standards and grading throughout the department
- Analyzed course-level grade distribution data to calculate AB and DFW rates, then compared it to other departments
- Opportunity to discuss standards and grading practices with faculty



How do we share workload?

- Wanted to understand if a full-time replacement was needed to replace a departing full-time faculty member
- Analyzed teaching loads per instructor and discovered that the departing faculty member taught closer to a half-time workload due to administrative and other course reassignments
- Opportunity to discuss how faculty define their workloads and workload equity within the department
