

### Costly Proliferation of Low-Demand Courses



#### **More Options, Higher Costs**

In effort to increase comprehensiveness, some institutions have added courses without reducing low-demand course offerings.



- Costly excess capacity in some courses
- Diverts resources away from high-demand, high-impact areas
- Challenges student progress

#### **Drivers of Proliferation**



#### **Academic Disciplines**

Faculty training, hiring, and tenure practices encourage specialization in both research and teaching



#### **Competition for Students**

Universities believe that adding more specialized programs will attract students and prepare them better for careers





#### **Incremental Budget Models**


Budget models typically incentivize academics to add new offerings without reducing the old

Change in Distinct Course Offerings (% Prev Year)

Analysis of percent change in attempted credit hours and percent change in distinct course offerings from the previous year at a high-research comprehensive in the 2016 academic year.

## Diagnosing Course and Enrollment Growth Mismatches



#### **Potential Misalignment of Resources**



#### Course Growth is Outpacing Enrollment Growth

- Excess instructional capacity is unused
- Students accumulate unnecessary credits due to number of course options



- Evaluate fill rates to determine if misalignment is causing underfilled capacity
- Consider offering fewer electives within a department



#### Enrollment Growth is Outpacing Course Growth

- · Increased teaching demand on faculty
- Students aren't able to take courses they need or want to enroll in



- Examine fill rates to identify bottlenecks
- Consider increasing the number of course and section offerings within a department

Compare annual percent changes in course offerings and student enrollment.




Drill into a course prefix to see annual counts of course offerings by department.



Analyze impact of course growth on fill rates for multiand single-section courses.


#### Change in Distinct Course Offerings vs. Attempted Credit Hours


