IT Strategic Planning

- · What's one thing you were hoping to accomplish that you weren't able to do or weren't able to get to? What held you back from accomplishing this?
- Imagine you're coming back into the IT department as the new CIO. What projects would you want to tackle first? What projects are critical to moving the university forward?
- Outside of funding or staffing levels, what's keeping this institution back from having a world-class IT department?
- · What are your recommendations for IT's involvement in [administrative or academic area]?



IT Departmental Assessment

- · Who are the up-and-coming leaders within the IT department that we should look to for future leadership positions?
- · What are the strengths of the current IT department? What are the weaknesses of the current IT department?
- What part of the institution's strategic plan is IT best at supporting? Struggling most at supporting?
- If you could change the organization of the IT department in any way, what would you change?
