I. Accomplishments and Achievements

- Provided crisis intervention, case management and discharge planning to students who had been medically or psychiatrically hospitalized and worked with students, their families, and treatment providers to coordinate follow-up care.

 - 0 students were medically hospitalized
 - 0 students were hospitalized for alcohol/substance intoxication and/or entered an addiction treatment program
 - 0 students were Marchman Acted
- Provided formalized monthly follow-up with treatment providers for students.
- Participated in 2 Student Assessment Committee meetings/staffings and provided follow-up, intervention and case management services to these students and their families.
- Participated in 0 Dean of Students Office Staff Meetings
- Participated in 1 Coordinated Care Team Meeting
- Provided case management, intervention, referral (mental health and health related), and follow-up services to students referred for various reasons which may include; injury and temporary disabilities, referrals to community resources, mental health crisis and issues, medical and psychiatric hospitalization, assault victim, death or serious illness of a student and/or family member, transition/adjustment issues, concern for peers, re-enrollment at the University, "missing" student, substance abuse assessment, concern expressed by faculty, staff, parent, student, etc.. In many of the referral cases I contacted or maintained numerous contacts with the students, their families, hospitals, treatment providers, and other University Departments and Personnel (Academic Deans, Health Center, Counseling Center, Financial Assistance Services, Registrar's Office, Student Account Services, Residence Halls, Dining Services, etc.) to coordinate care and services for students and their families.
