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
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Survey Overview



Campus Occupation and Closures


What percentage of undergraduate students are still in residence on campus?




What percentage of universityowned residence halls still have students living in them?


What percentage of buildings on your main campus have been officially closed out by Facilities/Estates?



Essential Personnel Orders


Does your local government have an "essential personnel only" order?

Essential vs. Non-Essential Construction Activity


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Some local governments have distinguished between essential and non-essential construction in their orders. For instance, the state of Pennsylvania considers only construction on health facilities as essential. Other local governments take a broader definition. New York state, for example, includes the following projects within the definition of essential construction: projects on roads, pubic or private schools, and hospitals and projects necessary to ensure the safety of occupants. Organizations must apply to receive approval for essential construction projects within these jurisdictions.




Is non-urgent/critical repair and renovation work continuing in existing campus buildings?


On average, what percentage of Facilities/Estates staff are on campus at any given time?


Are you offering additional or overtime pay to staff who must come to campus?




What percentage of maintenance staff is on campus during normal operating hours?


