



Intersession Professional Skills Boot Camp

- 4-week summer or winter session
- Team projects simulate the work environment
- Basic business, professional, and entrepreneurship skills
- Initial target: students at liberal arts colleges and elite universities



6-day boot camp required to start professional certificate program



7-day boot camp part of winter break internship

Case in Brief: Clark University's Accelerated Degree Program

- 60-70 undergraduate students enroll in the Accelerated Degree Program annually
- Accelerated Degree students compose 10-15% of graduate population
- · Available programs include:
 - Business Analytics
 - Chemistry
 - Communication
 - Environmental Science and Policy
 - International Development
 - Management
 - Public Administration
 - Teaching



Tuition discounting

Provides undergraduates with 50% discount, rising to free tuition for those with 3.4 GPA



Accelerated credit accumulation

Allows students to accrue graduate-level credits in their senior year



Institutional partnerships

Partners with local baccalaureate institutions to provide pathways into professional graduate programs



Require work experience or internships

Assists recent undergraduates in gaining professional experience to complement their area of study

Speed is the Advantage




- Require minimal time away from work / ideal for out of work professionals
- Professionals willing to pay for quick completion




A portfolio or other demonstration of skills at the end of the bootcamp is more important than a credential



Funding Complicates Displaced Worker Education

Dislocated Worker Funds Could Offer Opportunity

Student Self-Pay funding may struggle as displaced students experience financial problems and are price-sensitive

Employer Partnerships may be difficult to establish as employers decrease education support during recessions

Government-Funded Opportunity



Funding Determinations

Number of COVID-19 cases, initial claims to unemployment insurance, and population data in each state, ranging from \$200K to \$12M.



Who Can Apply?

Eligibility varies by state, but workers laid off due to quarantine orders, business closures, or missing work to care for a family member.



Economic Recovery Initiatives

Supported industries vary by state, but largely focus on redirecting workers to high-need fields, including medicine, logistics, and technical support.

University of Arkansas Dislocated Worker Training Program



- Free online training programs for underemployed and unemployed workers
- 75+ courses, including C++ programming certification, project management essentials, and digital marketing strategy
- Courses range in time commitment required, from 19 to 780 course hours















COVID-19 Amplifies Decline of the MBA

Employer Demand for Professionals with MBAs Declined Faster than Demand for All Professionals During Economic Shutdown

National demand over time for applicants with MBAs relative to all job postings



-45% Decline in job postings requesting an MBA from July 2019 to June 2020

Faster decline than the **-40%** decline in employer demand for all professionals

Traditional MBA Does Not Align with Student Needs

High-Cost and Selective

 Students can expect to spend up to \$160,000 on tuition alone

Time Intensive **Programming**

- Require full-time, inperson enrollment
- Takes two years to complete the degree

Broad, Generalized Curriculum

 Curriculum offers electives in general finance and management



Low-Cost Programs

- Students increasingly price sensitive
- Today's students face high student loan debt



Faster Time to Completion

- Skill development means more than degree attainment for adult learners
- Accelerated or parttime education meets employer needs now



Focus on Outcomes

- Students increasingly focused on return on investment
- Adult learners respond to outcomes-centric marketing (e.g., alumni outcomes data)







Median conferrals per program, 2018






Data Analytics Alone Reveals Multi-Layer Prospective Student Pool

Ill-Designed Programs Serve Students Poorly



Highly technical course developed by expert faculty appeals to inexperienced professionals

Introductory program focuses on implementation decisions but title attracts intended practitioners

Students fail to learn applied skills



Course promoted as latest technical evolutions teaches last year's developments

 Students recognize old information, fail to learn needed skills for today
