Questions to Ask Before a Unit

1. Why are we studying this topic?
2. Why is this an important topic for us to study? How does it connect to the world?
3. What do I already know about this topic?
4. How does this topic relate to what we've already learned?

Questions to Ask During a Unit

1. How can I connect this topic to what I already know about it?
2. What questions do I have about this topic now?
3. What about this topic confuses me or excites me?
4. How would I explain this topic to my friend who hasn't learned about it yet?
5. How do I know this topic works in this way? What evidence could I use to explain it?

Questions to Ask After a Unit

1. What were the most important ideas about this topic that I want to remember?
2. What do I need to learn more about regarding this topic?
3. How has this unit changed what I already knew about this topic?
4. Was my information about this topic accurate and complete before this unit?
5. How will I use this information later?
