24% Response Rate

10% Marked At-Risk


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- Leveraged the EAB Navigate tool to identify and engage students who may show early signs of low course performance.
- Employed several alert reasons including Keep Up the Good Work.

- Partnered with Academic Dean to communicate with faculty.
- Cases were automatically assigned to staff advisors, Dean and CARE team.
