### Questions to Inform Initial Course Discussions

#### Skills

- Which of our current courses integrate high-demand skills?
- What new course opportunities would confer high-demand skills?
- Are these skills relevant to a narrow suite of courses, or should most or all of our courses teach these skills?
- Do we emphasize these high-demand skills in our marketing messages?

#### Employers

- How often do our students find jobs with these top employers?
- How many employees of these top employers do we or have we previously served?
